THE ROWELL MEETING

which will be the day for a special canvass for funds to assist the wounded sailors and soldiers. "Why is it that here in Aylmer, we can meet quietly and be unmolested?" asked the speaker, "while France and Belgium are invaded and the people driven from their homes. We are safe because of the vigilance of the men in the British navy, who have kept open the commerce to every neutral port in the world. Every hour of every day of every month, our brave sailors are patrolling the high seas, watching for the enemy ships. On Trafalgar Day we will have the opportunity of showing our appreciation to these gallant sailors."

The Kaiser's Big Mistake

"The Kaiser," said Mr. Rowell, "made some big mistakes. He thought our Empire was so loosely joined together that the moment the shock of war came it would tumble to pieces. He judged us by his own subjects whom he ruled with the mailed fist, and was informed that Canada was aching for a chance to break away from the Motherland. We were with her in peace, and we are with her in war," said Mr. Rowell amid much applause. "Africa too, the Kaiser was certain, would break away, for in 1900, the Imperial Government passed a resolution (which was strongly opposed by Henry Campbell Bannerman, then a member of the House) that Gen. Botha, leader of the Boers, together with his associates, be banished from Africa. Later when Sir Henry Bannerman became Prime Minister, the first thing he did was to give South Africa the right of self government, and Gen. Botha was made Premier. Then when war broke out a year ago,

Botha, instead of holding spite for the resolution passed to banish him, as the Kaiser expected he would, led a victorious army and invaded German South West Africa, conquering the Germans, putting down revolution and adding another patch of red to the map of Great Britain, larger than the whole of Germany. This is an example of the right of self government. The Kaiser cannot understand it, because he knows nothing about it.

Regarding the war, he said we must make every sacrifice to attain the highest efficiency and victory, and the example of Lord Kitchener, France and Russia, imposes upon us the duty of ridding our country of the open bar.

"And the women," said the speaker, "it is easier for the son or husband to enlist in the activity of martial life than for the mother or wife, who stays at home during the long, silent days and months of worry, and perchance it finally will fall upon the wife to support and care for the little fatherless children. The women of Canada have nobly responded to every call for sacrifice placed upon them, and upon them really falls the biggest sacrifices of the war."

The meeting was opened and closed with the singing of the National Anthem.

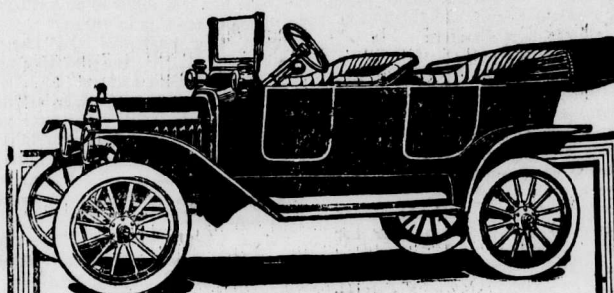
