Prof. Wiechert at Gettlingen has just had constructed two great seismographs. The instruments which record earthquakes even when the region shaken is thousands of miles away. One of them has a horizontal, the other a vertical pendulum. The horizontal pendulum weighs seventeen tons. Four levers placed in series multiply the movements of the ground 2,500 times. This apparatus is so sensitive that it registers the shocks transmitted to the earth by a gas motor a mile and a half distant. The vertical pendulum weighs 2,500 pounds, and its multiplying levers amplify the movements of the soil 100 times.

MR. BRYCE SAVES FROM GALLOWES

Pittsburg Murderer Given Respite at Request of British Ambassador.

Pittsburg, Pa., March 26.—William McLeod McDonald, the Scotchman who was to have been hanged here today for the murder of Bessie Smith, his common-law wife, is still alive, thanks alone to the intercession of Right Hon. James Bryce, the British ambassador at Washington. After Governor Stuart had refused to listen to the appeal of James W. Drape, a wealthy local Scotchman, Andrew Carnegie, who had been interested, and other well known men, Governor Stuart granted a stay upon the personal appeal of Ambassador Bryce. In doing so Governor Stuart declared that he believed the man should suffer the death penalty, but that he could not ignore the request of Great Britain's representative. Governor Stuart's respite is until April 28. In the meantime Mr. Drape and other Scotchmen are raising a fund, which will amount to \$1,000, for the purpose of employing attorneys, and defraying the expenses of a new trial, which they hope to have the courts grant. The claim will be made that McDonald is insane and that he did not have a proper trial.

In support of the insanity plea the fact will be prominently brought out that even since the move was started to have a respite granted for him, McDonald attempted to interfere on the grounds that the woman's ghost had visited him in his cell and declared that her death must be avenged. The crime for which McDonald was sentenced to die was a particularly atrocious one. On Sept. 18, 1907, McDonald discovered a letter in the possession of the woman with whom he had been living for several years and with whom he had eloped from England. He declared it was from her former lover. In a quarrel which followed McDonald cut the throat of the woman with a razor, almost severing her head from her body. Afterwards it was found that the letter the woman had received was from her husband. The latter later came here from Toronto, and secured possession of their 10-year-old son, who had been an eye-witness to the tragedy.

summed by Mr. Donovan (Brockville), who made a speech, while it amused the House, was of little value as a serious contribution to the records of the House. He complained that the Provincial Treasurer on the surplus, and said that the criticisms made by Mr. Atkinson (North Norfolk), had been the weakest ever heard in the House. Mr. Donovan expressed surprise at some statements made by Mr. Hislop (East Huron), and said that that member evidently sat in the House like an Egyptian mummy, wrapped in his own political prejudices.

Mr. Donovan, in contrasting the records of the Government of the day and the preceding one, summed them up in the following bills of fare:

Menus and Metaphors.

Mr. Donovan dilated upon these menus, and also mixed his metaphors with a somewhat by dragging in the honest suits of clothes which cover the body politic of the Government.

Mr. Donovan paid some further compliments to the Provincial Treasurer, the Provincial Secretary and the Premier. The prison labor problem was being solved, and the temperance people and liquor men were both satisfied with the license laws. On the other hand, said Mr. Donovan, the people of Ontario had given the Liberals the hook. He predicted that the next Liberal Premier was as yet a little boy.

Gets After Studholme.

Mr. Donovan then proceeded to criticize Mr. Studholme, the Labor member. The Labor people did not recognize Mr. Studholme as their representative. Mr. Studholme talked more and more, and said less than any other member, and every hour he talked cost the country \$100. Mr. Donovan spoke of the conditions enjoyed by the workman, who found as much pleasure in eating Johnny cake, drinking ale and loving his wife and children as though he was a millionaire.

Mr. Studholme rose to reply, and reminded the House that Mr. Donovan had wasted an hour on two bills-of-fare, full of "soups and things."

The Premier said that as guardian of the dignity of the House, he could not permit Mr. Studholme to break again into the debate. Mr. Studholme would have an opportunity later to reply to Mr. Donovan or any other member.

"I'd like to meet him on the platform," said the Labor man.

"Queensbury rules?" asked Hugh Clark.

MacKay rose to speak. He began by criticising the pretensions of the mining law, which forced the payment of dues or royalties on mining properties, from which the owner was making no money, but which, instead, was only swallowing his capital. He favored a graded royalty, so that rich mines would pay more than poor ones.

Mr. MacKay reiterated his conviction that the method of financing the university adopted by the Government, by which the House had no voice in fixing the yearly sums paid to the university, was one which forced the Legislature to satisfy itself. By thus silencing the House's voice, the Government had also succeeded in killing much of the Legislature's interest in the university, so that, when a few weeks ago the president gave a reception to the Legislature, only one private member turned up. Mr. MacKay said he would not be satisfied until that legislation was blotted out.

Taking up Mr. Lucas' criticism of himself on the temperance question, Mr. MacKay said that it was meaningless to ask where a man stood on a question for that was only a relative question. A man might favor local option in a rural community, while believing that it would be worthless in a city. Mr. MacKay said his own position was clear on the three-fifths clause. He stood for majority rule. He explained that his opposition to Premier Ross' projected temperance measures was based on objection to certain unwise features of the bills, and not to their general principle.

Where Surplus Came From.

Hon. Mr. MacKay showed that the surplus was the result of the sale of Cobalt and Kerr Lakes, without which, he showed, there would have been a deficit. He alluded to the receipts from additional subsidy and from succession duties and brewers' tax, which the Government had opposed while in opposition.

"The member for East Huron," continued Mr. MacKay, "made the most startling statement of the season, when he said that the Government had increased the taxation 1 per cent of population during the three years they had been in office."

"In the three years alone," the Liberal leader added, "they have increased the expenditure on civil government 46 per cent."

The Executioner.

Mr. MacKay accused the Government of concealing the payments to Mr. J. C. Judd, of London, "the individual secured to do the work the heads of the departments are ashamed to do."

"We know what Radcliffe is paid, but we do not know the rake-off of Judd, his fellow-craftsman," he declared, amid great applause.

Spoils System.

The Liberal leader accused the Government of introducing the spoils system. Much, he said, had been made of the improved administration of the license laws. For himself he had not noticed this improvement. Mr. MacKay related the history surrounding the resignations of Messrs. Flavell, Davidson and Murray, as license commissioners.

"We have reached the day," said Mr. MacKay, "when we should socially consider civil service reform."

The Liberal leader reviewed the various forms adopted in other countries, and advocated the adoption of the Wisconsin act. He regretted that law reform had not been given to the municipalities the information as fully and frankly as it should have done.

"I do not impeach the honor of the minister of power," added the Liberal leader, "but I say it was a strange position for the Government to take to let him force the policy on the municipalities, giving them only speeches to rely on instead of printed statements."

Mr. Whitney said that the financial criticism of the Liberal leader, amounted to a statement that if the treasury had not received so largely increased revenue, it would not
