A BIG CANADIAN APPLE SHOW
 To Be Held in Vancouver Oct. 31—Ontario Exhibits Wanted.

Ottawa, Aug. 25.—Maxwell Smith, manager of the Canadian National Apple Show, which will be held in Vancouver, Oct. 31 to Nov. 5, is in the capital today conferring with leading fruit growers with a view to having them exhibit at the show.

"British Columbia has taken the burden of financing this, the first national apple show," said Mr. Smith, in an interview, "but it is not our intention to hold it as an annual event in British Columbia. The second, third, and possibly the fourth, show will be held in the eastern provinces. We expect to have 15,000 barrels or boxes of apples on exhibition. Easterners who send their exhibits to our show will be creating a world market for themselves, for buyers from Eastern Canada, the United States, Australia, New Zealand, Great Britain, France and Germany will be present."
 Sir Thomas Shaughnessy is president of the show.
