

## DEMOCRATS HAVE SUFFRAGE PLANK; WOMEN PLEASSED

Favor Extension of Franchise to Them "State by State."

### ORDER OF PRESIDENT

Wilson Considers Plank Vital to Success of the Party.

### U. S. FOREIGN RELATIONS

Party Takes a Stand Against Crushing Small Nations.

ST. LOUIS, June 16.—The Democratic national convention finished its work today by adopting the party platform exactly as approved by President Wilson and submitted by the resolutions committee, including the plank on "Americanism" and that favoring women suffrage, but not until the harmony of its three days' sessions had been disturbed with a row over the suffrage plank.

No voice was raised against the vigorous declarations of the Americanism plank, but at one time it looked as if the suffrage plank had been lost. After Senator Walsh of Montana had told the convention that President Wilson himself considered it vital to party success, however it was voted into the platform by a ballot 883½ to 151½. The entire platform then was adopted without roll call.

The convention then adjourned sine die.

**Suffrage Plank.**

As it went into the platform the suffrage plank reads:

"We favor the extension of the franchise to the women of this country, state by state, on the same terms as to the men."

The women suffrage leaders considered it a much more favorable plank than they got from the Republican convention.

Referring to international relations the platform states:

**Foreign Relations.**

We hold that it is the duty of the United States to use its power not only to make itself safe at home, but also to make secure its just interests throughout the world, and both for this end and in the interest of humanity, to assist the world in securing settled peace and justice.

"We believe that every people has the right to choose its own government under which it shall live; that the small states of the world have a right to enjoy from other nations the same respect for their sovereignty and for their territorial integrity that great and powerful nations expect and insist upon; and that the world has a right to be free from every disturbance of its peace that has its origin in aggression or disregard of the rights of peoples and nations; and we believe that the time has come when it is the duty of the United States to join with the other nations of the world in any feasible assertion that will effectively serve these principles, to maintain inviolate the complete security of the highway of the seas for the common and unhindered use of all nations."

## HIGH TRIBUTE PAID TO CANADA'S MANHOOD

Washington Lawyer Speaker at Bar Association Banquet.

TORONTO, June 16.—Hon. Henry B. McFarland of Washington delivered an inspiring address at the annual banquet of the Canadian Bar Association tonight.

"Canada," he said, "has become great. Yours is the new life and the new consciousness, which mean leadership of this continent. You, through the ordeal of fire and blood, chastened, refined, uplifted and strengthened; you, as a caustic writer has said, wallowing in the luxury of materialism. You have found again that old-fashioned devotion to righteousness as such. You have spent freely of your manhood, of your money, but you have found your soul."

## BAPTIST ASSOCIATION APPROVES PROHIBITION

B. Y. P. U. is Shown To Be Important Branch of Church.

POPULAR HILL, June 16.—Rev. Joseph W. Kemp addressed the Baptist Association of Middlesex and Lambton on "Some Things That Will Happen When the Lord Comes." It was an earnest presentation of the pre-millennial view of the second coming of Christ, and was most practical.

The report of the secretary of the B. Y. P. U. work in the association was read by Miss L. Statham, Strathroy. There are societies in sixteen of the churches and six junior societies consisting of boys and girls from 6 to 16 years. About \$300 has been raised in the societies for missions.

Rev. J. E. Green of Forest gave a stirring address on "Young People's Work," and urged the old people to encourage the young folks to engage in work for the Lord.

An open conference on young people's work was conducted by Rev. A. C. Bingham.

It transpired that there were eight persons in the congregation who had been brought to Christ through a young people's society.

Various questions were asked and answered respecting the junior work and other phases of the work of the B. Y. P. U.

The foreign mission work was represented by Rev. A. A. McLeod, returned missionary from India, who commenced his address by a salutation in the Telugu language.

He painted a sad and realistic picture of the deplorable condition of the many millions of widows from one year old and upwards. The work is evangelistic in every part, even new converts try and spread the good news to their friends and neighbors.

It was a new thing in India to see men of different castes sitting together at the Lord's table, but a sight to thrill one.

In a mutual advice period three short addresses were delivered by J. K. McDermid of London, "If I Were a Pastor"; by Rev. J. D. McLachlan of Strathroy, "If I Were a Layman"; by Rev. T. W. Charnworth of Parthill, "If I Were a Deacon." All were bright and enjoyable.

Arrangements were made for holding Sunday school institutes in five centres in the association.
