London, Feb. 10 .- Egypt is "bursting with wealth" accumulated from cotton, says a correspondent of the Daily Express in Cairo.

"Illiterate natives living in mud huts have made 20,000 pounds sterling out of cotton deals," he continues; "some have made 100,000 pounds. They are buying land at inflated prices, and paying off mortgages which were regarded as family heirlooms. One British official says that the country has made at least 100,000,000 pounds. Naturally, there is an influx of new millionaires in Cairo, with a huge demand for automobiles, jewelry, new houses and all kinds of luxuries, but in the provinces many of the newly rich have not changed their standard of living at all.'
