BOARD ORDERS
FILTERING PLANT
Kitchener Must Extend Its Sewage Disposal System.

[Special to The Advertiser.]
KITCHENER, Sept. 28.—Kitchener must provide a sewage disposal plant for the Spring street section of the city, as a result of a decision reached by the board of health here today. The board passed a recommendation to the city council that a new filtering plant for sewage be constructed at Spring street to complete the present pumping station.

Waterloo County Road Superintendent Lichty has opened negotiations with the department of highways at Toronto for the purpose of getting the hill near St. Jacobs designated as a provincial county road in order that the hill may be paved to connect with the present concrete highway which, when completed, will stretch from the outskirts of Waterloo to Elmira. The department has indicated that it will ask for certain changes in the road before it will agree to pave the strip included in the provincial county road plan.

A light truck hit a street car here today with sufficient force to knock the car off its front track. The auto was slightly damaged. The accident occurred at the corner of King and South streets. As the street car was crossing the intersection the truck, driven by a Galt citizen, crashed head on into the car, putting the street car out of commission. Incidentally, the flivver truck lost a couple of wheels.

THRESHING FINISHED
IN CRINAN DISTRICT
Yield of Wheat Fair—Oats Much Below Average.

CRINAN, Sept. 28.—Threshing of grain has been completed throughout this district. This season was one of the shortest that threshers have had in this section for some years. The returns from wheat have been fair, but the oats and barley crops were very much below the usual yield. The past summer has been one of the driest ever experienced in this district, and with the extreme heat spring crops, with the exception of corn, were much poorer than usual. Farmers are now awaiting a heavy rain to make the land suitable for fall plowing.

The new school building in the newly-formed section on the Alderburgh-Dunwich town line is being rapidly rushed to completion. It is expected that the building will be completed and equipped before cold weather, and it will be opened after the new year.

GODERICH BURGLAR GETS SIX MONTHS

GODERICH, Sept. 28.—William Lockridge and William Bloomfield, who pleaded guilty two weeks ago to charges of robbery and receiving stolen goods, appeared before Magistrate Reid today for sentence. Lockridge and Bloomfield were connected with the robbery of McVicar's shoe store, Laurier's drug store, Wig's drug store, the Misner factory and with stealing chickens from Dan O'Brien.

John D. Kay, the third man, who Lockridge and Bloomfield say was with them on some of the robberies, pleaded not guilty in police court a week ago, and is awaiting trial by a judge and jury, by which he is elected to be tried.

Magistrate Reid sentenced Lockridge to six months in the reformatory and Bloomfield to three months in the county jail.

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DENIES RIGHT OF GOVT. TO FINES
City Enters Appeal Against Claims For Court Money.

ST. THOMAS, Sept. 28.—The Government is not satisfied with the amount which the city alleges to be due the department on account of fines collected for indictable offences. The recent visit of a provincial inspector, who investigated the records in the office of a local official, finds that the calculation of the amount due the department should include a period covering approximately the last twenty years. The recent audit of the police court books included, reached back about five years, and the amount claimed by the department was between \$2,000 and \$4,000. Although acknowledging that amount as being the sum collected, the city has appealed against the right of the department to claim any of the fines imposed, it being the opinion of the city solicitor that these specialties should be applied to the upkeep of the court and as a part allowance for the money invested in that part of the city building set apart for police court purposes.

The package indicated that during its eighteen years of traveling it had been to India, New Zealand and nearly all over the globe.

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HITS AT ROYALTY.
WASHINGTON, Sept. 28.—Anyone impersonating a king or queen in a play, pageant, or carnival would be liable to a fine of not more than \$10,000 and imprisonment for ten to twenty years, under a bill introduced today by Representative Herlick, Republican, Oklahoma. Similar penalties are proposed for producers who engage some one to act like a king or queen.

BARRIE, Sept. 28.—W. A. Boys, K.C., M.P., will be the Meligen candidate in the riding of South Simcoe in the approaching election. He was the only name submitted to the Conservative convention today at Cookstown.

LIBERALS CHOOSE McEACHREN.
NORTH BAY, Sept. 28.—Donald McEeachren, mayor of Cobalt, was today nominated over Mayor McKinnis of Timmins as Liberal candidate for Temiskaming in the forthcoming federal election. Only one ballot was taken, Mayor McEeachren receiving 114 votes out of the 182 cast.
