

Sister Mary Providence was a native of Sligo, Ireland, of a distinguished family, and received her early education in that eity. She came to Canada in 1850, and a year later joined the Order of St. Ann at Lachine. From Lachine she went to New York, and afer spending some years there decided to come to British Columbia at the solicitation of the Right Rev. Bishop Demers, who was then in charge of the diocese of Nictoria.
The trip to Vancouver island was a somewhat trying experience owing to the lack of transportation faelities. Accompanied by another sister she went from the Eastern States to the lathmus of Panama. From there they were carried across to the Pacific by natives and hoarded a sailing vessel for British Columbia. Sister Mary Providence and her companion were the first members of the order to numertake this tedious journey.
