

VICTORIANS MEET DEATH IN ATLIN

W. Elliott and A. St. George Bowly Lose Their Lives

(From Saturday's Daily)

Two Victorians were killed as a result of a cave-in at a mining claim on Spruce creek in the Atlin district on Wednesday evening.

A. Elliott, of the B.N.A. at Vancouver, who was among the passengers of the steamer "Royal Victoria" from Vancouver, had received a telegram from his brother a short time before the accident stating that he and Bowly had made a good strike on their claim and asking him to join them in the north.

On Thursday forenoon the two men were killed by a heavy cave-in. The men were on their way to work in the hope of getting the imprisoned men out, but successive failures and sloughs impeded their efforts and rendered the task of rescue extremely hazardous.

Both Elliott and Bowly were well known in Victoria. Elliott was taken about six years ago to the Bay of British North America in this city, and left that position to become clerk of the Victoria Hotel.
