FALL OF SOUTH SIDE OF SEBASTOPOL!!!

A Telegreph despatch was received at the important intelligence of the capture of south Sebastopol. We haven to lay the glorious news before our readers, in an extra.

Salues were fired at Halifax and other places last evening. The loyal and patriotic inhabitanits of the town of Sc George, celeing Bay, were occupied by our brave soldings with admirable enthusiasm and cry of "Vive L'Empereur" We occupied ourselves with endeavouring to secure our position, and succeeded in our object—the Malacoff.
