

WALL PAPER.

THOSE who believe or imagine they believe that Canadian manufacturers cannot produce beautiful and artistic papers should have seen the samples of Louis XVI. treatment forwarded to BOOKS AND NOTIONS office by John C. Watson & Co., wall paper manufacturers, Montreal. They are making long strides up the hill of Progress, getting nearer to the summit Perfection. The pattern mentioned was shown on two differently colored grounds, a light cream, and a dark greyish blue, approaching touch to a slate. The deep border with the pattern to match gave the paper a finished appearance; but above all, produced a deep impression that Canadian wall papers will some day exclude all others, and even now could do so, if the retail dealers would but think so. Mr. Watson writes that owing to the large number of repeats received during March and April, they were obliged to keep their factory running on stock much later than usual. They hope to have their new samples ready in June, and the leading styles will be Rococo, Empire and Louis XVI. treatments. Mr. Watson inclines to the opinion that there will be no reduction in the tariff next season, certainly not before all stock must be bought for the spring trade of 1891. This corresponds with what BOOKS AND NOTIONS suggested in a previous issue. Even if a reduction were made it will not affect present prices but slightly, as domestic manufacturers are not by any means taking full advantage of the tariff. As long as they continue to increase the quality of their papers and sell at usual close prices they will secure the bulk of the trade in cheap lines, and gradually a share of the best lines.

Special attention should be given to the advertisement of W. J. Page & Co., wall paper jobbers. They are offering clearance lots of this season's wall papers at greatly reduced prices, affording the dealer an excellent opportunity for sorting up his stock.

C. M. Taylor & Co. are still busy with their wall paper trade. Goods are being shipped regularly, and orders are still coming in from their travellers who are in the rural districts. They have had a most successful season with their lines, and orders promise fairly to deplete their present stock. This speaks well for the judgment of their buyer.

Funk & Wagnalls Co. have ready the sixth issue in John R. Moodie's Columbian Historical Novels, entitled, "A Century Too Soon," describing Bacon's Rebellion, and giving vivid pictures of the manners and customs one hundred years before the outbreak of the American Revolution. This book is fully illustrated, and has a well-made index.
