4. Technical Co-ordinator

- i) Technical co-ordination should not require an independent organ of the negotiations, but rather a co-ordinating mechanism assisting and directed by the Chairman of the Ad
 Hoc Committee.
- ii) The Technical Co-ordinator would normally come from the Ad <u>Hoc</u> Committee Chairman's delegation, and would assist individual Study Groups as appropriate.
- iii) The Technical Co-ordinator would have two primary functions:
 - a) responsibility for consultations within the <u>Ad Hoc</u> Committee on additional specific topics which should become the subject of in-depth study;
 - b) responsibility for administrative arrangements of these study groups and liaison between the groups and the Ad
 Hoc Committee.

To these ends the Technical Co-ordinator would consult informally as necessary with other delegations and experts.

iv) The Technical Co-ordinator would ask delegations to volunteer an expert to chair a study group and to volunteer an official rapporteur for the group.

5. Costing

If the group met while the CD was in session, the services of the secretariat should be used fully. If the group met elsewhere, or at a time when the CD was not in session, then the countries volunteering the study group chairman and/or rapporteur could perhaps volunteer to bear the extra administrative costs.
