Ethnic Composition:

The largest ethnic group, the Malays, make up about 52% of the population; the Chinese comprise 25%, with 15% indigenous tribes and 5% other.

Religion:

Islam is the official religion; 60% Muslim; 8% Christian and 32% other (Buddhist and animist).

Language:

Malay is the official language. English is widely used; Cantonese is spoken among the Chinese.

Type of Government:

Brunei is a constitutional sultanate in treaty relationship with Britain, which retains responsibility for defence and foreign affairs. Full independence is scheduled for January 1, 1984. It appears probable that Brunei will remain an autocracy, with Sultan Hassanal Bolkiah retaining absolute power. There has been no effective opposition to the Sultan since the Brunei People's Party was banned after leading a brief abortive rebellion in 1962.
