The following Resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That it is expedient to introduce a measure to implement the Interim Convention on Conservation of North Pacific Fur Seals, signed at Washington on the 9th of February, 1957, by Canada, the United States of America, Japan, and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, and for carrying out Canada's obligations under the said Interim Convention.

The said Resolution was reported and concurred in.

Mr. Pickersgill, for Mr. Sinclair, by leave of the House, presented a Bill, No. 412, An Act to implement the Interim Convention on Conservation of North Pacific Fur Seals, which was read the first time.

By unanimous consent, the said Bill was read the second time and referred to the *Standing Committee on Marine and Fisheries*.

The Bill No. 225 (Letter X-7 of the Senate), intituled: "An Act to amend The Eastern Rocky Mountain Forest Conservation Act", was considered in Committee of the Whole, reported without amendment, read the third time and passed.

The amendment made by the Senate to Bill No. 160, An Act to amend the Exchequer Court Act, was read the second time and concurred in.

The Order being read for the second reading of Bill No. 209 (Letter F of the Senate), intituled: "An Act to amend the Territorial Lands Act";
