Dear Mr. Egan:-

I understand that an exhibition is opening shortly in New Zealand, and we might send to it the exhibit which we had at Wembley last year. Very little space would be required, about 4 ft. sq. being sufficient.

The exhibit consists of a delineascope which gives a number of views of the University and of Montreal. As it requires electric current to operate, and has to be adjusted before being sent away, I should be glad to know what voltage is available at the New Zealand Exhibition. I assume that there would be no charge for transportation or for space as far as the University is concerned.
