not only as a previous Step, necessary to our Reconciliation with Spain, but as a Means of preventing the utter Ruin of our Commerce; for what Trade can support such an high Duty, accumulated upon all those Imports which the profligate Wit of former Times could invent,

or Profusion require!

If therefore the present M----y will make good their high Pretentions to Public Spirit, let them ease our Trade of its insupportable Burdens; let them give due Encouragement to our Colonies and Fisheries in general, and to the Herring Fishery in particular, as the great Sources of our naval Power: let the obvious Means above mentioned, be taken for that Purpose, and for discharging the Nation 1 Debt: Let a first Oeconomy be observed in all the Expences of Government; not grudging however what is necessary to promote our Fisheries, and to establish our new Colony of Nova Scotia, as the great Barrier and Safeguard of the British Dominions, and Fishery in America: and in particular, let all our old false Maxims in Politicks be abandoned, as tending more to the Advantage of other Nations than of this our native Country.
