gave Jealoufy to the reigning Administra-The War with France commencing about this Juncture, it was imagined, that a Body of British Troops would have been employed in defence of his Majesty's Electoral Dominions, which were invaded by the Enemy. Then, and not till then, Mr. P- refumed his Patriot-Principles, and once more manfully. opposed Continental Measures, declaring, that, if a fingle Man was fent to Germany, he should look on such a Step as making ourselves Principals on the Continent. Happy, thrice happy, had it been for us, if he had stedfastly persevered in these National Sentiments. Millions then would have been faved to Great-Britain: Her People, too, would have been faved; whereas the Want of Hands has been feverely felt of late in almost all our Manufactures. 2 14 .
