Caption title of separate numbers, and collation of vol. 1, nos. 1-22, March 10, to Aug. 4, 1826. According to Rusk's "Literature of the Middle Western Frontier," 1925, vol. 1, p. 159, the paper was founded "to debate the vexed question of the abolition of the Court of Appeals," of Kentucky.

After Dec. 6, 1826, continued as a regular newspaper, beginning again with vol. 1, no. 1.—C.

Caption title. The first 33 numbers published weekly to promote the Whig cause during the presidential campaign of 1840. Contains a life of William Henry Harrison. The prospectus in the first issue is signed, S. Nye & Co. According to a note in no. 33, Oct. 28, 1840, "This number closes the publication of this paper. We shall, however, so soon as the result of the pending election is fully ascertained, send to each subscriber a table of the electoral vote in each of the States, in a form to be appended to the volume." No. 34 has the caption: "Supplement to the 'Spirit of '76.' . . . January 20, 1840" [sic]. AAS. has a second edition of no. 3, June 30, 1840.
