EDUCATION BOARD BUILDING PROGRAM

Will Submit Bylaw to People if City Refuses Grant.

The board of education's building program for 1920 will probably go to the city on New Year's Day. The school management committee decided on Wednesday evening to have Chief Inspector Cowley report the needs for 1920, and then the estimates will be taken to the city council. If they offer any fight on it, I would say let them submit the bylaw for the money to the people," said Chairman P. P. Hanbury. The committee showed a great tendency to enlarge the supervising staff. First it went on the names of Miss Anna Hunter, Miss Jessie Johnston and Miss Rosa Dexter-McLeod as assistant music supervisors. Thompson, the drill instructor of the cadets, was mentioned, and he was decided to ask him what assistance he required. Physical culture came next, and it was agreed to assign a coach to each assistance. Mr. Bertha Strigley wants. These appointments will probably be made to date from next January.

PURE QUEENS VITAL Beekeepers Hear Experts at Closing Session of Convention.

The thirty-ninth annual convention of the Ontario Beekeepers' Association, which has been held in the Carls-Rite Hotel, came to a close at the end of the afternoon session yesterday. At a previous sitting the association decided to ask for a \$30,000 grant from the provincial government, and held an election of directors for the ensuing year. At the morning session yesterday J. L. Evers of Markham, the "Bee King" of Ontario, gave an interesting address on "The Location of an Apiary." D. A. Davis pressed upon those present the importance of pure-bred queen bees, because upon them rested the prosperity of the beekeeper. At the closing session Miss Iona Fowler lectured on the prevention of swarms, and John Meyers addressed the large meeting on "What Would Beekeepers Like to Know?"

WILL TEST ORDER Liberty League Desires to Export Case of Spirits From Montreal to Toronto.

The Citizens' Liberty League, in order to test the validity of the order-in-council with reference to the importation of spirits from another province into Ontario, has discovered whether or not the provisions of said order-in-council have now been terminated, have decided to import a case of spirits from Montreal to Toronto, and consigned to the private residence of one of their members, and in this way have the matter tested in a court. At a conference between J. D. Macdonald, chairman of the licensing board, T. L. Moanahan and Secretary T. L. Caruthers, Mr. Flaherty, of the Ontario Liquor Commission, stated that the purpose of this test case, the board would not make a prohibition of the shipper or carrier, but would confine any action taken to the person to whom the parcel was addressed.

WILLS AND BEQUESTS

John McGrogan, a teamster who died in Toronto on Oct. 17, by a will made Jan. 7, 1908, left his estate, valued at \$2704, to his wife, Mrs. Mary McGrogan, so long as she remains his widow. On her death or remarriage, the estate reverts to the testator's three children. Mrs. Joseph Mitchell, sole beneficiary and executrix, has applied for probate of the will, which was executed Sept. 10 last by her husband, William Mitchell, a merchant in Toronto, who died Oct. 9, leaving stock in trade valued at \$850, and \$25 in personal effects. Mrs. Isabelle Edwards, who died in Toronto on Oct. 29, left her estate, valued at \$2278, to her sister, Mrs. Mary Agnes London. By his will, dated April 15 last, John James Menear, a Toronto builder, who died at Windsor, Ont., on Oct. 13, left his estate, consisting of real estate, cash and personal effects, valued at \$1775, to his widow and son. Mrs. Annie Stein, Fannie and William Dinitz, all of Toronto, will share equally in the estate of their brother, Sam Dinitz, formerly a window cleaner in Brooklyn, who died in France, Nov. 12, 1918, of wounds received in active service. The estate consists of \$104 in Liberty Bonds, \$770 cash, and two lots at Crowland, \$100.
