This boat left Charlotte last barrie This boat left Charlotte last night loaded with 1000 tons of coal for the Toronto Electric Light Company. The wind was blowing a gale when the boat left the harbor, and as soon as it got fairly out into the lake, the full fury of the storm struck it. After bedtling for three miles, the bange finally gave up the task as hope-less, turned about and came back into the harbor. The steam barge John Rugee of Ogdensburg came into the harbor at Charlotte at 8 o'clock this morning after a trying experience. morning after a trying experience. Fortunately, it was running light, a fact which probably saved it. but when the barge finally made the harbor this morning it was encrusted with ice and snow.
