Salary to be Raised \$500 - Council Can Not Pass Resolution-Chink Assaulted Countryman.

HAMILTON, June 10.-(Special.)-

The city council had a three-hour ses-

sion to-night. Aldermen Farrar, Evans and Peregrine argued for some time in favor of a further move for consideration and negotiation with the Cataract Power and Street Railway Companies. Ald. Farrar and Evans first tried to get a resolution passed appointing a special committee of the council to negotiate with the comcouncil to negotiate with the company. They could only get Ald. After a tie vote on the proposal to submit bylaw to go back to the ward system of electing aldermen, it was finally

agreed to refer the matter back for further consideration. Geo. A. Rutherford was reappointed to the hospital board. The water-works was given one reading and referred to the finance committee.


