Aid. Spence: I think it is quite plain. He (Thompson) did not canvass or solicit votes for Mr. Shaw, but he did take an active part in his behalf.

Aid. Frame: I have a motion here which I would like to move. It is: "That the Board of Control recommend the Council to adopt the following resolution: That this Council deeply regrets the strongly condemn the active interference of certain members of the fire department in municipal elections as reported by the county judge, such action on the part of civic employees being exceedingly improper and unnecessary, and having a tendency to seriously interfere with discipline and efficiency in the public service."

The Mayor: Is that as far as you are concerned to end the matter?

Aid. Spence: Yes, I wish to express it. I certainly deeply regret it. The Mayor: To what extent? To the extent of expressing it?

LAMB GETS A SECRETARY. At \$100 a Month to Work Out His Radial Railway Scheme for Toronto.

At the meeting of the Board of Control yesterday Aid. Lamb appeared with a bundle of plans showing the area of the city, Lawrence Market and his proposals for facilitating entrance of the radial railways.

All that Aid. Lamb wanted was a secretary to carry on correspondence with the municipalities.

The Mayor: This has taken a lot of money already.

Aid. Sheppard: Will Aid. Lamb assure us that the secretary will do anything to help the radial railways centering in Toronto?

Aid. Lamb: I suppose what Aid. Sheppard is after is the "missing link." This might be got in three ways. First of all, the best line around Toronto. This might be got easily. It is costing the Grand Trunk Railway \$30,000 a year. But if we could not want to avail ourselves of that the Toronto Street Railway Company might give running powers on their lines under certain conditions. In the third way we might apply to the Legislature jointly with the municipalities for a passage thru certain streets of Toronto.

Aid. Spence asked how much the secretary would cost.

Aid. Lamb said they could get all the way from \$200 to \$1000 a year. The committee (composed of Aid. Leble and himself) wanted a first-class man.

Aid. Spence: If this scheme of entering the radial railways in Toronto could be carried out it would be a tremendous thing. But what is it that Aid. Lamb wants us to approve of. He asks us to appoint a secretary who will go to the townships and say: Are you going to help us get help us in what? He has no definite plan, and it may all turn out to the benefit of a syndicate of capitalists who will construct and operate these railways. I am strongly with Aid. Lamb as far as he really aims at centering the radial railways in Toronto.

Aid. Lamb: You are not.

Aid. Spence: I will put it this way. I will move: "That the Board of Control recommend the submission for approval of a definite and comprehensive plan of constructing, financing and operating a system of radial railways centering at the St. Lawrence Market in Toronto, the board being strongly desirous of aiding any well-defined plan of attaining this desirable result."

Aid. Sheppard moved in amendment that the Committee on Works be authorized to employ a secretary as requested by Aid. Lamb for three months, at a salary of \$100 a month.

The amendment was carried, and Aid. Lamb went away happy. The Mayor did not vote, and Frame supported Sheppard. Bowman was absent.

Order of the Procession. In all the Public schools there will be patriotic exercises during the forenoon, and the part Canada is to take in its development. Addresses will be given by trustees, ministers and teachers, and the pupils will do their part in essay, recitation and song.

At 2 o'clock a procession will start from the Armouries and proceed to Queen's Park to decorate the soldiers' monuments, by the way of the Avenue, Queen-street, Simcoe-street, King-street, Yonge-street and Grosvenor-street. His Excellency, Lord Dufferin and Col. Peters, D.O.C., will review the Public school drill companies on Simcoe-street.

Children's Concert at Night. At 8 o'clock in Massey Hall, there will be a grand patriotic concert, given by 800 pupils of the Public schools, led by Mr. Cringan, and national marches and recitations by 150 pupils under Major Thompson. The concert is under the patronage of Lord and Lady Minto and Sir Oliver and Miss Mowat.

A VAUDEVILLE TRUST. The Concentration Policy Has Extended Now to the Show People, It Seems. New York, May 22.—The vaudeville managers from various parts of the country, whose ostensible purpose is to organize a trust, and who have been holding their conferences in Boston, transferred their meeting place to Brooklyn yesterday. The session extended over two hours and after adjournment none would talk as to what was accomplished. This action on the part of those who are attending the conference demonstrated that no publicity shall be given to their scheme until final arrangements have been completed.


