TORONTO-LONDON RADIAL MAY GET UNDER WAY SOON

Mayor Church Makes Significant Remark After Private Meeting.

WILL SIGN AGREEMENT

Two Members of Board of Control Kick, But Are in Minority.

TORONTO, July 15.—At a private conference today, attended by Mayor Church, Sir Adam Beck, the members of the board of control, Corporation Counsel Geary, Commissioner of Works Harris and other civic officials, the mayor was instructed by the board of control to sign the hydro-radial agreement, as authorized by bylaw No. 1549, passed in 1916.

Under this agreement the city agrees to make no agreement or arrangement with, and to grant no bonus or other inducement to any other railway or transportation company without the consent of the commission (hydro-electric commission).

The agreement with Toronto and other municipalities was made for the construction and operation of an electric railway from Toronto to London under the hydro electric railway act of 1914. It has been signed by all but 10 per cent of the municipalities affected.

Mayor Church, Controller Maguire and Controller Robbins voted to sign the agreement and Controllers McBride and Cameron opposed it. Controller McBride emerged from the meeting before the proceedings, indicating that the whole thing had been done without first obtaining the opinion of the city's legal department.

"The whole business," he asserted, "was railroaded through by the mayor, who was supported by Controller Robbins and Controller Maguire. I was strongly opposed to it, but it was rushed through by them."

Mayor Church, at the conclusion of the session, stated that the signing of the agreement had been decided upon so that the hydro-electric commission could go ahead with the work.

HY. FORD WANTS ANOTHER WAR IF LEAGUE FAILS

Wants To See Situation Thoroughly Cleaned Up.

MAKES MANY ADMISSIONS

Much of His Pacifist Literature Written by Publicity Agent.

MOUNT CLEMENS, Mich., July 15.—Henry Ford made many frank admissions in his \$1,000,000 libel suit against the Chicago Daily Tribune. Examination by Attorney Elliott G. Stevenson, representing the Tribune, today and said that more than ever he considered it "bunk" growing out of tradition; nor had he any personal use for music or other forms of art.

He reaffirmed his belief that professional soldiers are murderers, nor would he exempt Gen. Pershing or Gen. Grant from this category.

He said that this present view is for the "fullest preparedness, unless there is a league of nations and that if the war just concluded in Europe does not result in such a league, he favors another great war, without delay, in order to clean up the situation thoroughly that universal peace would be had."

It developed that Theodore De Lavigne, a publicity agent for Mr. Ford, wrote practically all of Mr. Ford's pacifist literature and that much of it was circulated broadcast without Mr. Ford having read it.

"I will accept full responsibility for it, however," Mr. Ford testified repeatedly.

LIBERAL-FARMER IS NOMINATED BY SOUTH BRUCE ASSOCIATION

Meeting Applauds Dewart's Vigorous Leadership.

FRANK RENNIE CANDIDATE

Enthusiastic Indorsement Is Given Provincial Liberal Platform.

FORMOSA, July 15.—Members of the South Bruce Liberal Association tonight adopted a resolution indorsing the platform planned at the Liberal provincial convention at Toronto.

The meeting applauded Mr. Dewart's vigorous leadership and excellent qualities as candidate.

Mr. Dewart scored the Government unmercifully for its "messing around" with Ontario's agricultural problems, and said that out of the situation thus created the new farmers' party was formed.

He entreated the gathering by declaring that the policies of the United Farmers and Liberals were almost identical, and that there were no grounds on which they could not unite.

Frank Rennie of Walkerton, himself a practical farmer, was chosen by the meeting as candidate to contest the riding at the next provincial election. His only opponent on the ballot after several nominees had withdrawn was Thomas Purdy of Greenock, who boldly announced himself as a United Farmer, who was willing to follow the new leader. At the final count the ballot stood 87 against 21.

Officers for the ensuing year were elected as follows: President, W. Rowand, Walkerton; vice-president, S. R. Brill, Teeswater; Secretary, J. A. Johnson, Midway; treasurer, E. B. Ingessmer, Formosa.

FORD CONCERN INCREASES CAPITAL FROM \$100,000 TO A HUNDRED MILLIONS

WILMINGTON, Del., July 15.—By certificate filed at Dover today, the Eastern Holding Company changed its name to Ford Motor Company, and increased the capital from \$100,000 to \$100,000,000.

The Eastern Holding Company was chartered July 9, 1918, with a capital of \$100,000 to deal in investments. The amending certificate filed today did not disclose any reason for using "Ford Motor" in the name of the company, merely stating that the change was authorized at a meeting of the board of directors, held in New York yesterday. No reason for the change was known at the office of the secretary of state.

DETROIT OFFICIALS QUIET.
DETROIT, July 15.—Action of the Eastern Holding Company in changing its name to Ford Motor Company and increasing its capital stock to \$100,000,000 follows the announcement authorized here July 11, the recapitalization of the Ford Company would be undertaken with the purchase by Edsel Ford, of very near all the minority stock of the corporation. The officials of the Ford company here this afternoon declined to discuss the action taken in Delaware. When asked whether the eastern company would take over the shares of the present Ford company and issue its own shares to the stockholders, they declared that a statement at this time would be premature.

Directors of the Ford Motor Company some years ago voted to increase the capital to \$100,000,000 because the investment in the business was much greater than its capital. It was found, however, that the Michigan laws did not permit corporations to capitalize for more than \$25,000,000.

URGE ALL NATIONS TO OPPOSE ACT OF HUNGARIAN SOVIET

Funds From Sale of Securities Might Be Used For Propaganda.

PARIS, July 15.—(Havas Agency).—The inter-Allied council today asked all nations to oppose the sale in Hungary and which the Hungarian soviet government has ordered the banks to deliver.
