SUGAR SCHEDULE PASSED.

United States Senate Has at Last Dispos

Washington, June 15.—The Senate made a great stride forward to-day by completing the consideration of the sugar schedule of the tariff bill except the provision relating to Hawaii, which went over. As agreed to, the schedule placed on sugar not above No. 16, Dutch standard, cone cent per pound, and .03 of a cent for every degree above 75; and on sugars above No. 16, Dutch standard, 1.05 cents per pound. The other provisions of the schedule relate to maple sugar, maple syrup candy, etc. Only one yea and nay vote was taken during the day on the amendment of Mr. Lindsay (Kentucky) to nake the rate 1.8 cent per pound on sugar above No. 16 Dutch standard. The amendment was defeated 32—35.
