### AL. WILSON'S NEW PLAY.

Al. H. Wilson, credited by many with being the most popular singing comedian, will be seen as the central character in his new song-adorned comedy, "It Happened in Potsdam," an adaptation from the French by Cyril Reed, which is described as a dainty love romance set in a frame of mirth and comedy. It is written along the usual Wilson lines of mirth and refinement, not a word or situation in the piece being calculated to offend the most modest person. The author has provided a delightful atmosphere, with the result that it is said to be the most characteristically German comedy presented in years. Mr. Wil-

son is acknowledged to be one of the sweetest-voiced singers on the stage, and in "It Happened in Potsdam" he has ample opportunity to display the strength and control of his voice. His impersonation of the eccentric German who returns from an extended journey to the Orient for the purpose of marrying the sweetheart of his boyhood days is equal to his ability to sing and his artistic love making is of the kind that is both pleasing and amusing. The play is said to be constructed along lines different from those introduced in any of Mr. Wilson's previous offerings. A description of Mr. Wilson's new vehicle would not be complete without mention of the musical part of the program. With each new production he can be depended upon to furnish several new

Throughout the action of the comedy there are interspersed several tuneful melodies that will no doubt be appreciated by those who admire the Wilson style of songs. They include "When You Part from the Girl You Love," "Songs of Old Fatherland," "Her Smile" and "Loves of Bygone Days." He will also introduce a selection from the best of his favorite songs made famous in the past. There will be the usual matinee during the engagement. The plot contains many mirth-provoking situations caused by the eccentric character of Metz Von Klutz, the eccentric German, in his efforts to secure a wife within the time prescribed by the terms of his wealthy uncle's will when he learns that his former sweetheart whom he intended to wed is happily married to a Russian Duke.
