Stirring Rescue Tale Develops From New York Fire

Outbreak in Tenement Deprives Several Families of Their Homes

NEW YORK, Feb. 12—Twelve persons were rescued by firemen in the early morning from a burning five-story tenement at 312 Amsterdam avenue. Many persons living in the building had descended the fire escapes unaided when the firemen arrived, but two families were awakened too late.
