PREMIER OLIVER WINS BY-ELECTION

Nelson, B. C., Aug. 24—Premier Oliver was elected Saturday to represent Nelson riding in the Provincial Legislature, his majority over Harry Houston, Independent, the nominee of the Citizens Party, being 338. Mr. Oliver polled 1,124 votes, while Mr. Houston received 786.

The by-election here was brought about by the resignation of Kenneth Campbell, Liberal, who gave up his seat to provide a riding for the Premier, who was defeated in Victoria in the general elections of June 20.

Professor John Merle Coulter, Head of the Department of Botany at the University of Chicago and the next Convocation Orator at that institution, lectured during the recent Toronto meeting of the British Association for the Advancement of Science on the progress of botanical study and research in China, as he saw it during his recent preliminary visit. The most important botanical work of Professor Coulter said, is being conducted at the National South-Eastern University of Nanking and at Nanking University. It is notable in being concerned chiefly with practical problems in developing the natural resources of the country. The College of Agriculture of South-Eastern University at present has one large experimental station and sub-stations, all well equipped. The principal botanical enterprises now under way in China include a complete collection of the native plants of central China, not only for purposes of classification but also as sources of valuable raw materials and drugs; reforestation, for most of China is completely denuded of trees; improvement of vegetables and of cotton and problems of plant diseases.

ALUMNAE MEETS. The Sacred Heart Convent (Halifax) Alumnae held a meeting on Saturday afternoon preliminary to entering on the new season's activities. The meeting was held at the summer residence of Mrs. George Carvell, president, at Duck Cove. Amongst other business transacted a nominating committee was appointed. At the close of the meeting luncheon was served and there was social enjoyment. The alumnae will hold its next meeting early in September.
