Dr. W. Chozko, the Minister of Health,
informed him there were only 8,000 doctors in the entire 30,000,000 population
in Poland. Rovno has been the principal port of entry for people entering
Poland from Russia, and there Colonel
Gibbs saw persons of all ages and both
sexes in the last stages of typhus. In a
barracks intended for 3,000 soldiers there
were 6,000 sick, suffering from lack of
water. In one room eight feet by twelve
he found eighteen persons living. A
hospital equipped for 200 patients contained 500 Siberians. They were mostly
typhus victims, and the death rate was
25 per cent. There were also many
deaths from pneumonia.

"No time should be lost," Colonel
Gibbs said, "by the people of the United
States in assisting Poland to fight this
terrible battle against disease." Before
leaving he was decorated with the Polish
Order of 1790.


