National Library of Paris and various private sources. Many of the titles were unique. From these negatives photostat copies were made and bound. By this means not only the Historical Society but other libraries are enriching their collections with reproductions of rare books and other material, making them readily available for historical students.

Among these reproductions were fifty-two titles relating to early New York history, twenty-one relating to Philadelphia, and several of Boston and Cambridge. Among them were twenty-three printed by William Bradford in New York in 1696, being the first year of printing in this city. With the exception of a broadside of Aug. 25, 1698, destroyed in the Albany library fire of 1911, the list now forms a complete record of all the known books and broadsides printed during the first year of printing in New York.

one-sixth of the territory had been taken over \$200,000,000 in gold alone, nearly one-half the production of gold in the whole history of Canada. Silver Replaces Gold. The Yukon was in a state of transition from the placer camps to the lode mines. In 1919 rich silver ores had been uncovered and in a few years he predicted that the Yukon would be one of the greatest silver camps in the world. The population had doubled since the discoveries of 1919. So far the silver area had been disclosed to be about five miles wide and ten miles long. Some of the ore went 3,000 ounces to the ton. It required 100 tons of ore to produce one ton of silver. The high grade to repay mining. They could not handle ore of less than \$100 a ton owing to the great transportation costs. Three thousand tons of this high grade ore were being shipped this winter. The carriages of tons were already blocked out waiting to be handled in a large way. Water-powers were being hooked up to provide energy.

BOBBED HAIR IGNORED. Philadelphia Board of Education Says Question Rests With Teachers. Philadelphia, April 11—The Philadelphia Board of Education is worrying little about a question that has agitated other communities, namely, whether school teachers will be permitted to bob their hair if they desire. The matter rests entirely with the teachers, and the younger ones with curled locks need not fear dismissal, Edwin C. Broome, superintendent of schools, has decreed.

The question, Broome added, seemed rather insignificant to devote one's attention to or make a pother about. Whether an individual should wear long or short hair, he stated, is a question largely of fitness and taste, and is objectionable or not in the measure in which the person's conduct and manners in other respects are open to criticism. All that was required, the superintendent declared, was that the teachers dress neatly and modestly.

SIX-CENT FARE FOR CHICAGO. Transfers Will Be Free During Test Period of Eight Months. Chicago, April 11—A six-cent street car fare for Chicago, effective May 1, was ordered by the Illinois Commerce Commission. Transfers will be issued at present without additional charge. Children may ride for three cents. The new order was announced by Chairman Smith as an experiment which will run until Jan. 1. The rate, it is estimated, will give a gross income of \$48,000,000 a year to the surface lines. A return to the company of 5 per cent, on valuation, instead of 6 per cent, as at present, is figured.
