HUNGARIANS ERECT MONUMENT TO AMERICAN RED CROSS CHIEF



Budapest, May 18--(Associated Press) --The first European statue to a living American has been erected by Húngary in honor of James A. Pedlow, American Red Cross commissioner here. It is situated in the municipal park, near the Washington memorial. In his address at the unveiling cere-monies Count Apponyi declared that "the Americans are the only real paci-fists in the world who are showing a spirit of reconciliation in their generous charity toward the vanquished." Thousands of children in gala dress paraded in front of the statue and heap-ed flowers around it.
