

in Dublin, where the newspapers had been more or less ridiculing the covenant, and where the A. O. H. and the United Irish League were very active.

Lord Justice Holmes said:—"As far as one can judge from what one reads in the newspapers, the newspapers here in Dublin that represent what I presume would be the views of the signers of the covenant all say that on this subject of home rule the Nationalists are absolutely aparthetic. I read that in two or three newspapers."

Mr. Chambers:—"Does Your Lordship gather from the speeches of any of these gentlemen that they were apathetic?"

Lord Justice Holmes:—"I gather it from the other side."

Mr. Chambers said that if this action were tried in Dublin it any case in which there was a political question. He believed that absolute justice would be done by the jurors of the County Down, even by the men who signed the covenant. The charges made against the plaintiffs were absolutely foreign to their minds and habits and had no foundation.

The Lord Chief Baron said that a person who had signed the covenant would not be a proper juror.


