




## PELKEY AND SMITH MAY MEET



CANADA'S DAIRYING INDUSTRY

"The ice cream trade in Canada and the home consumption of milk is valued at more than \$30,000,000 a year, making it rank next in importance to buttermaking and greatly surpassing in value the output of cheese. The dairying output in Canada represents more than \$109,000,000 each year," writes J. A. Ruddick, Canada's Dairy Commissioner, in this week's issue of the Journal of Commerce, Montreal.

"There are now 3,760 cheese factories and creameries in the dominion and 12 condensed milk and milk powder fac-
