have said, at a low figure, intending to monopolize the whole cotton industry of a canada. They will work only those millis which will pay best, and I am not certain that if they got hold of the St. John mills they would operate them. It would be very much to the disadvantage of the wholesale trade in the maritime provinces to send to Montreal for goods made here, and moreover this would certainly affect prices.

"Now with regard to the management of mills, I do not think that a syndicate is a more competent management than an individual—provided of course the latter understands the business. A syndicate cannot buy cheaper, nor can it produce cheaper, but if it has the monopoly it can practically fix its own prices. It is certainly true that in 4pper Canada labor can be secured at a cheaper rate than here, because the French are willing to work at low wages. This is fully off.et, however, by the superior intelligence of our employes, which enables them to do more work and do it better.

"We are having a large output at present. Both factories are running to their fullest capacity, and it is difficult almost to get employes. This proves conclusively that in St. John at least work is not scarce, and it should be sufficient evidence that we have no very poor here. export trade. There seems to be no reason why this increase in production should not continue. I have never found any difficulty in competing with Upper Canadian manufacturers, and our export trade is done chieffy with Quebe, Montreal, London, (Ont.), Hamilton, Winnipeg and Halifax, although we have some with the West Indies. We will not go into the syndicate if we can possibly help it. The Moncton, Halifax and other miles did not go in voluntarity; they were waslowed up by the syndicate; in the keen competition they were worsted and were practically compelled to sell out. And the reason they could not compete with these manufacturers was only because the management could not have been efficient. They sold out at a loss, the mills bringing not more than half the sum they cost, None of these factories, with the exception of the one at Kingston, (Ont.) I believe, has been paying, and the shareholders were willing to be rid of them even at a loss.
