THE BUILDING BOOM.

NEW BUILDINGS GOING UP IN
EVERY DIRECTION.

What Has Been Done by the Architects,
Masons and Carpenters. New Build-
ings Planned and in Course of Erec-
tion.

The Gazette, on the 25th of May last,
published an account of the building im-
provements that had been completed or
commenced in the city since the opening
of the year, which showed that a veritable
building boom had struck St. John.

The summer has been an excellent
one for continuing the good work and
architects, contractors, masons, brick-
layers, carpenters and builders of all
kinds have had all the work they could
do, and the most favorable weather to work
in.

Besides the large number of new build-
ings of every description that have been
erected, or are in course of construction,
there has been some repairing and im-
proving of old buildings done this sea-
son for many years past. With the
vacant lots in the city being rapidly built
up and the old buildings being either
rebuilt or remodelled, or improved and
painted up, our numerous visitors during
the summer have had plenty of evidence
of the prosperity of our city, and of the
fact that it is passing a splendid season.

Now new canons move.

In course of construction next St.
John Baptist church on Broad
street, Lower Cove, will be a handsome
building of brick with free-stone trim-
mings. It will measure 27 feet front and
run back about 60 feet, being about
35 feet wide at the rear end. Mr. G.
Ernest Fairweather is the architect.

The Baptist house, the exterior of which
is almost completed, is a handsome
brick structure, fronting 65 feet 5 inches
on St. James street and extending back
about 11 feet 1 inch on the rear end. It
is three stories in height with a large
basement.

The building will contain the kitchen
dining room, parlour, large front room,
rooms and saloon' closets. On the first
floor to the right of the entrance will be
the parlour parlor with bed-room, bath-
room and closets adjoining, while the
rear end will be used for the saloon and
dormitories etc.

To the left of the front entrance on the
same floor will be a large parlour room,
calculated to seat one hundred persons,
and behind it is a small room, reading
room, the clerk's office and a trunk room.
The second floor will be left off into
two bedrooms and bedrooms for the saloon.
There will also be a bathroom on this
floor. The third floor is not to be finish-
ed at present.

The front, which has the appearance
of being composed of pressed brick, is
built of stock brick, made by the con-
tractor, Messrs. B. Money & Sons. Mr.
Patrick Money is doing the mason work
on this road. Mr. J. T. McKean is the
carpenter work, is looking after that
part of the construction.

Mr. Thos. Curry has the three story
brick building on Prince William street
near St. James, almost completed. The
building will have a shop on the ground
floor, and is owned by Mr. John Richards.
Mr. Harold Perley has had a stone and
brick basement built on Germain street
near St. James street on which he in-
tends to erect a two story wooden resi-
dence.

Mr. W. L. Prince's four fine brick
residences on the site of the old Victoria
Hotel are being rebuilt in a more im-
proved style, and the buildings have been
soon ready for plastering. These
buildings are three stories in height with
