

GEORGE the FIFTH, by the Grace of GOD, of the United W. E. Davidson, Britain and Ire-Governor, [L. 8] British Dominions

WHEREAS We deem it expedient and necessary to appoint a Term cr Session for the holding of Our Supreme Court on Circuit for the Northern District of Our Island of Newfoundland, at the time and place hereinafter mentioned:

We do, therefore, by this Our Proclamation, declare to all Our loving subjects within Our said Island that it is Our will and pleasure to direct and appoint that a term or Session of Our said Supreme Court on Circuit shall be The regular services at the Adventist Church will be as follows:—Sabbath (Saturday) Sabbath School 2 to 3 p.m., followed by a regular service 3.15 to 4.15.
