LONDON, Eng., Sept. 29.—Lord Milner in the Nineteenth Century, writing on the value of the Canadian preference, says when British goods are competing with foreign goods in any part of the British Empire on more or less equal terms, even a moderate preference in favor of the British goods will turn the scale in their favor. Where they are competing against a slight but decided disadvantage such a preference can neutralize the disadvantage, and where the disadvantage is great owing to distance or other natural causes of a preponderating character, or even of the settled habits or customs of an important community, no preference that I desire to see imposed can wholly counteract the disadvantage, and though preference may certainly mitigate it it cannot work miracles, but it can and does exercise so great an influence on the course of trade that it is well worth making some effort and even some sacrifice to maintain and extend it.
