STRANGERS ROBBED DRURY COVE CAMP

Preese and Hogan Captured at Rothesay

Had Taken a Lot of Stuff Belonging to Four St. John Boys—Remanded Till Afternoon.

Thomas Preese and James Hogan, two men who give Ireland as their home, but who claim to have recently arrived from Boston, were arrested about 5:30 o'clock yesterday afternoon in a camp near Rothesay by Detective Killen and policeman Gossline. They were charged with stealing a quantity of clothing and other articles from young men who had a camp in Drury Cove. The stolen articles were found in the possession of the two men, who had taken them from the boys' tent. The boys' tent was found empty.

LeRoy Sandall testified that he and others had a tent at Drury Cove. Eldon Merritt, Archer Manks and Lester Smith were also members of the party who owned the tent and had been there on Monday night and things were all right. On visiting the tent Wednesday he found that the place had been robbed. There had been three locked boxes. Witness and Smith each had a separate box and there was also a general box, all of which he locked before he left Monday evening. On Wednesday the tent was tied up nearly the same as he had left it Monday night. The tarp on the big box had been broken clean of the corners. A dress suit case was missing, the rifle and two quilts, a pair of pants and a coat were stolen. It was also discovered that two other boxes had been broken into. A board had been lifted out of the top of Manks' box and a jacket, raincoat, cup, pepper duster, boot brush and a mirror stolen from the other box. A half loaf of bread was broken and there were also missing two bathing suits, a felt hat and a cap, a sweater, a pair of pants, a pair of socks and a pair of shoes. The barrel of the rifle was bent. Witness identified his property as that found in the prisoners' shoes on him and said he purchased them in Boston.

CURKE FINED FOR ASSAULT ON DRIVER GALLAGHER

Fredrickton is Having a Share of the Prevailing Storm—Supt. Carter Moving to the Capital.
