It seems scarcely necessary to point out that in the event of a great naval war, with the altered conditions under which sea fights would be waged in these days, it would be hopeless to expect to supply the British Isles from such distant granaries as Argentine, India or Australia, owing to the risks attendant upon such long voyages. The main reliance must be upon the United States and Canada, and one danger in regard to the former country is that grain may be "cornered" and advanced to famine figures. But as the wheat area of Canada expands this risk will be diminished, and when the needs for the hurried transport of foodstuffs to the Mother Country arises, a "corner" in grain, at least, will be avoided.

The only problem, then, which will present itself to the admiralty is that of safely conveying the grain ear versacross the Atlantic. The neutral vessels will be allowed unrestricted access to British ports with logistuffs is generally recognized, for it is impossible to conceive of a nation like the United States permitting her ships to be relied and their carrioes confiscated. 
