LEFT QUARANTINE.

Montreal, April 5.—The steamer Montevideo left quarantine at 9.45 a. m. yesterday and docked at Vancouver at 4.45 p. m. Part of the crew and all the passengers are still detained in quarantine. The vessel started discharging at 5 o'clock last night.

DANGEROUS TO NAVIGATION.

New York, April 5.—Str Millpool, reports that on the 21st N. 10, 31 W., passed close to an iron spar buoy showing about 12 feet out of water; upper part very rusty; lower part covered with marine growth.
