BRITAIN FOR SIGNING PEACE TREATY FIRST

Ministers Urge Leaving World League Questions for Settlement at Later Sessions.

London, Jan. 10.—The Daily Mail's political correspondent says: "Representations have been made by the Foreign Office and the War Office urging that a general peace settlement shall be the first business of the Peace Conference, leaving the details till later. The reasons for this course are obvious, one of the most important being that it would enable the Foreign Office and the War Office to discuss a general peace settlement with the League of Nations, and the territorial settlement of the Balkans could be decided after a peace settlement on a broad basis had been reached. If this course is followed, it is hoped that peace may be signed within about a month after the first meeting of the conference."
