London, Jan. 10.—The Daily Mail's political correspondent says:

"Representations have been made by the Foreign Office and the War Office urging that a general peace settlement shall be the first business of the Peace Conference, leaving the course are obvious, one of the most important being that it would enable an early general demobilization of the army. The question will be discussed by the War Cabinet, and there is every likelihood that as a consequence the British Government will urge this course at the early meetings of the interallied conference in Paris.

"It is believed that President Wilson is in accord with this view. Such questions as the freedom of the seas, the League of Nations, and the territoral settlement of the Balkans could be decided after a peace settlement on a broad basis had been reached. If this course is followed, it is hoped that peace may be signed within about a month after the first meeting of the conference."
