DOMINION DRY LAW WILL BE PASSED

Ottawa, Oct. 9.—So far as the caucus is concerned the storm over the new prohibition legislation has been weathered by the Government. Ontario members at today's gathering found fault with the bill being introduced at this inopportune time because of the imminence of a provincial general election on a similar issue, and they and other found the measure to exceed what a previous caucus had defined as its limit, but vigorous as they were they comprised a minority. The consensus of opinion was that the bill should be proceeded with and in due course it would be taken up.

Senate May Kill It.
There can be no question that the bill will pass the Commons. What will be its fate in the Senate is another matter. The view is heard again that the Upper House may administer chloroform, but of this there is doubt for two reasons. One is that the Senate has always inclined considerably to the view, as embodied in the bill, that the question should be one for provincial opinion. The other is that they are tired of becoming the whipping post of a less courageous Commons.

Wet Spell in Sight.
In any event a wet spell is in sight. The peace treaty may be ratified by the necessary three of the signatory powers and officially proclaimed in a fortnight. When this is done, presumably, but not necessarily, the War Measures Act on the Subject of prohibition will be suspended. But in reality it will hold good until there is a peace proclamation with the least, as well as the greatest of enemy countries. This is the contention of the Minister of Justice and the constitutionality of the argument isn't much questioned. However, the whole thing will be signed up before very long and then the restrictive order will pass out. When it does the ban on the importation, the manufacture and interprovincial traffic in
