- JOHNSON, GEORGE, of Ottawa, Dominion Statistician.....Page 1351**
Government statistician, his term of service, duties, condition of statistics ; general and gradual improvement in completeness, later returns fuller than earlier (19734a-19783a ; 19808a-19813a). Statistical result of violation of the license law (19784a-19786a). Preparation of statistics *re* Scott Act ; how arrived at ; an abstract proposition ; act in St. John City (19787a-19807a ; 19821a to page 1360). Vital statistics (19814a-19820a).

Archdeacon of Ottawa and Rector of Christ Church (19826a-19828a). Scott Act in Carleton ; clergy found it a failure (19829a-19837a). Little drunkenness, great improvement ; why (19843a). Thirty years in Orders, suffering caused by liquor, problems difficult of solution (19870a-19875a). Favours Gothenburg system, would abolish treating and bars (19876a-19883a). Almonte hotelmen superior class (19884a-19886a ; 19009a-19015a). Special treatment wanted for habitual drunkards (19887a). License law well observed (19888a). Wine for Communion (19889a-19891a).
