Uplands, Ontario	December 1st 1943		Overcast, occasionally cloudy. The use of all institutes on the Station was limited today until further notice, owing to danger of influenza contagion.	
	December 2nd 1943		Cloudy to overcast and hazy. A good day's flying put in by personnel of Training Wing.	
	December 3rd 1943		Overcast, occasionally light snow. The Massey Harris Combines Revue was presented in the Recreation Hall. It was an excellent show attended only by service personnel, in view of the influenza epidemic.	
	December 4th 1943		Cloudy to overcast. Snow showers. R183618 LAC Potts, D.B., landed Harvard No. 3168 near Bancroft, Ontario, causing serious damage to the aircraft. An "A" category crash, and slight injury to the pilot. Cause of the accident is obscure and is still under investigation.	
	December 5th 1943		Clear. Divine Services were held in the Recreation Hall in the morning. Flying during the afternoon only.	
	December 6th 1943		Overcast, snow. Flying for part of the day, only.	
	December 7th 1943		Overcast, snow flurries. The regular Tuesday evening movie was well attended in the Recreation Hall.	
	December 8th 1943		Low clouds and haze.
