Monsieur Miyaoka stated that the R esolution would have his support, as being the only alternative to an investigation from a modical point of view of the Opium question. After some discussion, in which Dr. Hamilton Tright and Dr Rössler took part, the latter proposing an amendment, which, however, was lost on being with put to the vote, the Resolution was adopted, the only change made being the substitution of the word "permit" for "undertake".

The Chinese Resolutions were left over for discussion at the next session.

The Commission adjourned at 4-40 P.M.
