The Department is informed that certain repairs are required at the Maniwaki school before the re-opening after the vacation.

The school-house itself should be cleaned, and something should be done to make the cupboard warmer. The closets also should be cleaned.

It is understood that the Indians are in the habit of using this school-house for holding public meetings and that they very often leave it in a filthy condition. If they are allowed to use the school-house, they should be required to leave it in a presentable condition; otherwise the use of the building for these meetings will have to be discontinued.
