EASTERN FRONT

Red Army troops are fighting the Germans along the IPOLY River, N of the DANUBE bend, and are little more than 85 miles from BRATISLAVA.

The PARIS Radio reports that the Hungarian puppet Prime Minister SZALASI has been seriously wounded in an

attempted assisination.

There is no confirmation of this report.

GREECE

Leftist ELAS Militia turned new rifle and arty
fire on British troops this morning.
Rumors that the Archbishop of ATHENS might become
temporary Regent and attempt to settle the dispute still
are current.

The Temporary Regime would serve until a Plebiscite could be held to decide on whether the Permanent Greek Government will be a Monarchy or Republic. The British have acknowledged today that the

Leftist Fighters last night infiltrated OMONIA Square, and laid mines.

ITALIAN FRONT

Canadian troops are holding against strong enemy opposition the NAVIGLIO CANAL bridgehead NA of BAGNACVALIO. Heavy fighting continues.

On the FIFTH Army front, British troops are mopping up the enemy from TOSSIGNANO and BORGO TOSSIGNANO, SW of IMOLA.

JAPAN

TOKYO has announced that American planes were again over the City during the day.

PHILIPPINES

TOKYO reports that 400 Allied planes attacked LUZON Island for the second day in succession.

WESTERN FRONT

All FOUR American Armies are now fighting on German soil.

The SEVENTH Army crossed the border today, the crossing came after they had reached WISSEMBOURG.

The SEVENTH Army now stands less than 7 miles of KARLSRUHE, and within 35 miles of MANNHEIM and LUDWIGSHAFEN.

The Germans claim that KARLSRUHE is now under Allied arty fire.

The THIRD Army continues to make gains near SAAR-LAUTERN and DILLENGEN in the SAAR BASIN. BIRGHL has been captured by the U.S.FIRST Army. Patrol actions are only reported along the British

front today.

AIR OPERATIONS

HANNOVER & CASSELS were bombed by more than 650 American planes today.

BURMA

BUTH IDAUNG has been recaptured by Allied troops.
