Canadian Government Agent at Detroit.

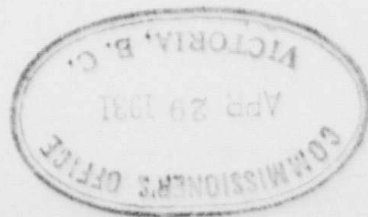
Reference is made in their letter to "Garden
