

A Yes.

Q About five acres would be sufficient for them, would it?

A Yes.

Q Do you know Swindle Island?

A I have passed by it.

Q Do you know if there are any Indian houses there?

A I could not say.

Q You have never seen them?

A No.

Q Do you know whether they fish from that Island?

A I am inclined to think they do.

Q What sort of fish do they catch when they go to that Island?

A ~~For~~ salmon, in the streams, ~~do~~-salmon and humpbacks.

Q And these are the fish they cure for their winter use?

A Yes, I know they fish halibut around that Island also.

Q Do you think they should have some reserves on that Island?

A Mr Tyson went up there to look into these locations - I have never been requested to look into those locations.

Q At Swindle Island we have evidence of the Indians having three houses at Quekwa(No.6); it appears we can get five acres for them for a fishing-station, <sup>there</sup> they also wanted another station on the Island, but we cannot get that. Do you think they should have a fishing-station on that Island?

A Yes, I do.

Q Will you recommend that?

A Yes.

Q And you think if they had five acres on that Island it would be sufficient?

A It is hard for me to express an opinion, but if Mr Tyson has examined into it I will take his word for it. If the Commission thinks it is necessary and desirable, I shall try to make a personal examination of the land covered by all the applications on the Coast, and I can if you wish make a personal report on them at Victoria during the latter part of November.
