It is a common faying, and a true one; that Idlenefs is the mother of all evils; and I may fay; not only temporal; fuch as poverty, want; difeafe; but alfo fpiritual evils; fince idlenefs leads men into all manner of fins or temptations thereto, for want of better employment.

Although industry is your duiy as a christian; yet you must not entirely trust to that : But must alk the bleffing of God upon it, and truft to his goodness for the fruits of your labour. For tho' you work ever fo hard, you cannot make any thing grow ou of the earth, if God fends not proper weather, and do not make your ground fruitful; and if he does not give you firength, and vigour and health, you cannot even work. Therefore you must rely upon his goodness; and humbly pray him for your daily bread; that is for his bleffing of your honeft endeavours. David fays: Truft in the Lord and do good, fo shalt thou dwell in the land, and verily thou shalt be fed, Pf. 37. 3., Honeft industry, fupported by an humble and faithful reliance upon God's mercy and goodness, can hardly fail of fuccess; for the Lord is good, a strong hold in the day of trouble, and he knoweth them that trust in him, Neh. 1.7.
