

The engraving is copied from Emerson's superb work on Trees. Of the noble veteran among forest trees, he writes : "Some of the most remarkable trees of Europe are chestnut trees. On Mount Ætna is the *Castagne di cento cavalli*, so called from its having shelts hundred cavaliers. Brydone found this, in 1770, two hundred and four feet in circumference; and it had the appearance of five distinct trees. A century I w. -n seen by Kircher, they were united, so that probably it had been one tree."
